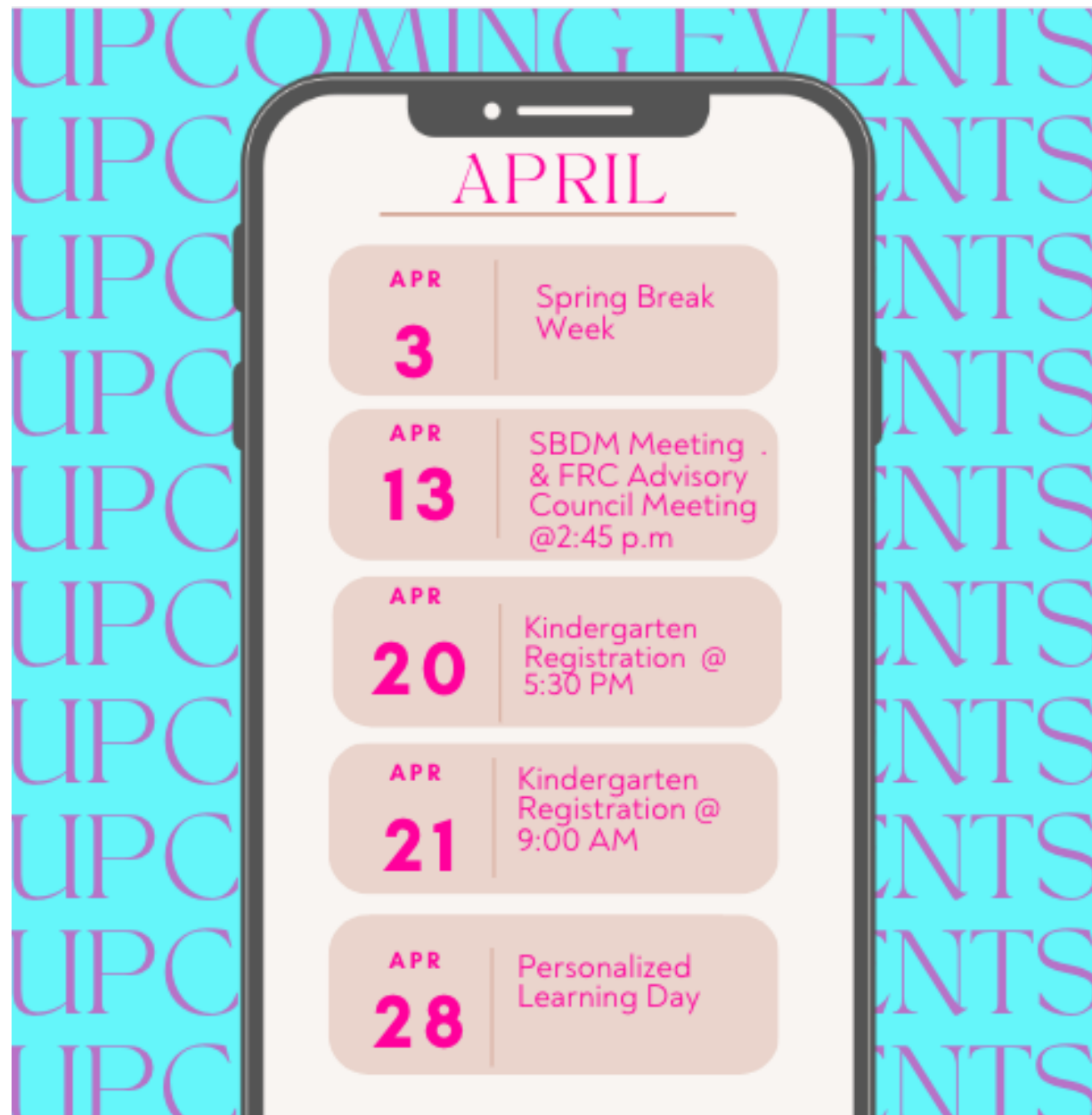

### How to Order Your Yearbook Online

1. Go to balfour.com.
2. Click "Shop My School" at the top.
3. Type in the zip code for Heritage: 40076. When you do this, Heritage should pop up below the search bar.
4. Click on Heritage Elementary School, Waddy, KY
5. It will take you to the Heritage Yearbook Webpage. Under the picture and title that says, "Yearbook Product and Ads," click on the box that says, "Order Now".
6. Enter your student's information and click "Shop for this Student".
7. Click "Get Started" in the Yearbook Only Package box.
8. Choose your student's homeroom teacher. **Keep the quantity as 1** and click "Add to Cart".

**IF YOU ARE BUYING MULTIPLE YEARBOOKS, you will need to purchase them separately.** (For example, if you are buying two books for two students, please order them separately instead of grouping them in the same order.)\*\*\*\*

9. Click "Checkout" and walk through the steps to purchase a yearbook.

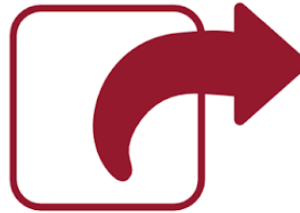

Using problem solving skills helps to handle disagreements and problems that may come up.

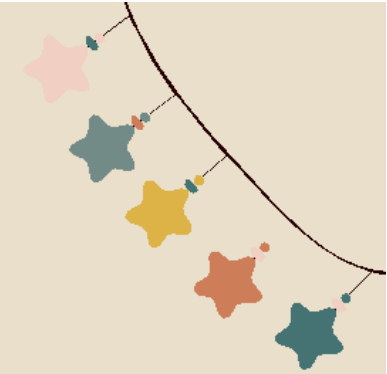
## Reflecting on Choices

Dear Heritage Families:

We are announcing the fee structure for the 2022-23 school year for all our elementary grades.

- **No device usage fee** will be charged, however, damaged or lost items will still require a payment.
- **A simpler, less expensive supply list** has been developed for use by all elementary grades, district-wide.
- All elementary schools will charge the same **\$20 instructional fee** and no other fees will be charged for instructional supplies; this \$20 will cover items such as headphones, erasers, Primary journals, additional or specialized folders and notebooks, rulers, index cards, highlighters, agenda books, field day t-shirts, recorders, etc.
- Any elementary student participating in at least one school club will be charged **only one \$20 club fee** instead of multiple individual club fees.
- **No other fees** will be charged during the 2022-23 school year for elementary grades except for occasional field trips; the maximum fee an elementary parent will pay is \$40 (plus field trips)
- **No other requests** will be made for elementary parents to send in classroom supplies for the 2022-23 school year

A waiver or adjustment may be made for any student qualifying for free or reduced meals to ensure that no student is denied services due to the inability to pay. In order for your student to receive the fee waiver, you are required to complete the Educational Benefit Form (EBF).

If you would like to donate additional funds or supplies, you can do so by contacting the school office or the Family Resource Center.

# Volunteer Income Tax Assistance



The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program offers free help to people who generally make \$54,000 or less, persons with disabilities, the elderly, and limited English Speaking taxpayers who need help in preparing their tax returns. IRS-certified volunteers provide free basic income tax return preparation with electronic filing for qualified individuals.

To qualify for this program, you must:

- Earn moderate income or less, or
- Be disabled, or
- Be limited English Speaking; or
- Be a senior citizen

They may also go to their local office to see worker and obtain and sign an FS-70, replacement request form. The form that was shared was an old form. The new revision date is 3/22 and generated when they speak to worker.

## Public Health Emergency Unwinding

### Kentucky Medicaid Renewals

#### Here is what you need to know to stay covered!

If you or a family member currently has health coverage through Medicaid or the Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program, called KCHIP, there are changes coming.

#### What's changing?

Because of COVID-19, the federal government declared a public health emergency (PHE). During this time, changes were made so that Medicaid and KCHIP renewals were not required, so people did not lose their coverage.

However, Kentucky will restart Medicaid annual renewals April 1, 2023. Make sure you take the necessary steps to keep your coverage!

★ **You will receive a letter when it is your time to renew.**

#### What do you need to do?

**1 Update your information:**

Make sure [kynect.ky.gov](https://kynect.ky.gov)

has your correct:

- ✓ mailing address
- ✓ phone number
- ✓ email

This way, we can contact you without delay.

**2**

**Check your mail:**

You will get a letter about your Medicaid or KCHIP renewal **when it is your time**. The letter will let you know if you need to complete a form or send in information to keep your coverage.

**3**

**Send in information:**

If you get a form, fill it out, return it right away. Make sure to give us any information we request. The information will help determine if you still qualify for coverage.

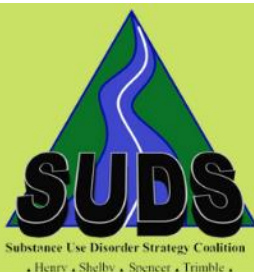

# Get The Facts On Kentucky's Utility Sales Tax

## What happened?

In 2022, the Kentucky State Legislature voted to repeal the tax exemption on residential utilities, except for those used in primary residences.

Starting in 2023, if Kentuckians own or rent more than one property in the state, they will pay 6% sales tax on utilities (electric, gas, water, sewer, and other services) in any property that is not their primary residence.

## Own Your Home?

In most cases, customers that were previously exempt will remain that way.

**If the only property you own is your main home, your utilities will not be taxed.**

**Homeowners with multiple houses are responsible for letting their utility provider know which property is their main home.**

The new 6% sales tax on utilities **only** applies to Kentucky residents who have multiple residences in the Commonwealth.

This change applies to secondary properties such as vacation houses, or property used as short term rentals, like AirBnB.

Customers who own more than one residential property should complete the same form as renters (Declaration of Domicile) and submit it to their utility provider.

## What If I'm A Renter?

Renters must complete the form linked on this page and submit it to their utility provider to avoid the 6% tax increase on their utility bills. This will establish the rental as their primary living space.

Some landlords may collect the forms and submit them on behalf of their renters.

## Own Rental Property?



Property owners must complete a *Multi-Unit Declaration of Domicile for Landlords* form (available by scanning the QR code). The declaration must a) specify the number of units and b) have a corresponding Declaration of Domicile form for each unit.

Multi-Unit declarations that do not include these forms from **all** dwelling units are not eligible for residential tax treatment.





# Kentucky Energy Savings Fact Sheet

## Changes Ahead

Winter is coming! Average electricity prices for homeowners have increased 10.5% over the same time period last year and could increase an additional 3% in 2023. Homeowners should be prepared that a larger percentage of household budget will be for electricity and home heating fuel expenses.

## What's Going On?

The global pandemic and war have disrupted global energy markets. Kentucky's coal and gas resources are global commodities and due to supply and demand changes, prices have risen just like other items we use every day. As a result of fuel prices increasing, the price consumers pay for electricity will rise going into winter when heating demand increases.

## Energy Efficiency Tips to Increase Savings

- Open window curtains during the day to allow sunlight to naturally heat the home, and close them at night to reduce the chill from cold windows.
- Replace furnace and heat pump filters once a month or as needed.
- Use a heavy-duty, clear plastic sheet on a frame or tape clear plastic film to the inside of drafty window frames during the cold winter months. Make sure the plastic is tightly sealed.
- When you are home and awake, set the thermostat as low as is comfortable.
- Keep the temperature of the water heater on the warm setting (120°F). This also helps avoid scalding.
- Find and seal air leaks around chimneys, pipe cut-throughs, and unfinished spaces behind cupboards and closets.

## A support program for grieving youth

Gravity. It grounds us. It holds us in orbit. It helps us stay centered. It pulls against us when rocketing into the stratosphere. Grief works much the same way. G-Force refers to the pull of gravity when making a transition forward. It takes practice and conditioning to withstand the pressure and to adapt. So does grief. We are not helpless in the face of loss. We can become stronger, more resilient, and confident that we can do hard things.

G-FORCE is a peer-centered education, support, and networking opportunity for youth coping with loss due to death. Meetings occur throughout the year offering a cycle every fall and spring following the school calendar. Youth can join at any point and re-up in an upcoming cycle.
